not an issue and there were no OSHA inspectors. The Showers

Company was already gressive in that respect. The History of Lawrence and

Monroe Counties, Indiana published in 1914 states that the company had 1,200 men pro-

viding a living for their families. The children of the Showers brothers went into the business and insured family

continuity. **Today the Showers Company** no longer exists. What happened to it? Perhaps only the descendents of the company founders really know. The answer is probably not a simple one. The depression and new

mass-production methods must have taken a heavy toll on the company. By 1955 it was shut down for good. The factory buildings sat idle for some time until Indiana University acquired them for

storage and renovation of furniture used in offices, dormitories and classrooms. Meanwhile the buildings

stand as a reminder of a large part of Bloomington's past.
