


Adventures with Barefoot Critters **by Teagan White** (Ej 411 Whi)

An adorable cast of animals explore the alphabet through the seasons. Recommended for ages 1–3.




Don't Let the Pigeon Drive the Bus **by Mo Willems** (Call Ej Wil)


The Alphabet Tree **by Leo Lionni** (Ej Lio)

When a fierce wind blows a group of letters from their tree, they learn to band together to form words and sentences to create a message stronger than the wind. Recommended for ages 2–6.




Fifteen Animals **by Sandra Boynton** (Board Book)

A boy describes his 15 pets—all named Bob. Recommended for ages birth–3.




The Bad Seed **by Jory John** (Ej Joh)

A funny, charming book about a bad-tempered seed that reminds us all that positive change is possible for all of us. Recommended for ages 3–7.




Good Night Gorilla **by Peggy Rathmann** (Ej Rat)

An oblivious zookeeper is followed home by all the animals he thinks are safely asleep at the zoo. Recommended for ages birth–3.




Bear's Busy Family: ***La Familia Ocupada de Oso*** **by Stella Blackstone** **and Debbie Marter** (Ej Bla)

In this adorable bilingual board book, use all five senses to follow a friendly bear around his house and learn why his family is so busy. Recommended for ages 1–3.




I Sang You Down from the Stars **by Tasha Spillett-Sumner** (Ej Spi)

A heartwarming story about an Indigenous mother preparing for her baby's arrival by collecting items for a sacred medicine bundle. Recommended for ages 3–7.




The Circus Ship **by Chris Van Dusen** (Ej Van)

After swimming to shore when their circus ship sinks, a group of animals become beloved members of a community in this rhyming book with entertaining artwork. Recommended for ages 2–6.




Jam Berry **by Bruce Degen** (Ej Deg)

A little boy in the forest meets a friendly bear that takes him on a delicious berry-picking adventure in the magical world of Berryland. Recommended for ages 1–3.




The Kissing Hand


Monsters at the End of This Book


Please Baby Please

The adventures of Peter, a little boy in the city on a very snowy day. Recommended for ages 1–4.




Splash!
