

Though scoffed at by Harold the dog, Chester the cat tries to warn his human family that their foundling baby bunny must be a vampire.




Big Bad Detective Agency by Bruce Hale(Juvenile First Chapter Books - J Hale)


The Case of the Missing Marquess by Nancy Springer (Juvenile Fiction - J Springe) Series: An Enola Holmes Mystery; 1

Enola Holmes, much younger sister of detective Sherlock Holmes, must travel to London in disguise to unravel the disappearance of her missing mother.






Indiana Bones by Harry Heape (Juvenile Fiction - J Heape)


The Midnight Children by Dan Gemeinhart (Juvenile Fiction - J Gemeinh)
