



***Arsenic and Adobo*

**Series: *Haunted Haven mysteries, 1.***





**Series: *Nora Best novels, 1.***





**Series: *Underwater Investigation Unit, 2.***





 by Elsa Hart**





***Clark and Division* by Naomi Hirahara**





 by Anne Mette Hancock**






### **A Little Bird by Wendy James**


### **The Missing American by Kwei Quarthey** **Series: Emma Djan novels, 1.**


### **Palms, Paradise, Poison** **by John Keyse-Walker**


### **A Study in Scarlet Women** **by Sherry Thomas** **Series: Lady Sherlock novels, 1.**


### **The Thursday Murder Club** **by Richard Osman** **Series: Thursday Murder Club, 1.**


### **The Verifiers by Jane Pek**


### **Where the Lost Girls Go** **by Rosalind Noonan** **Series: Laura Mori, 1.**
