






### Diapers Are Not Forever by Elizabeth Verdick (Juvenile Board Books)




## **Dinosaur vs. The Potty**

Sign-carrying mice give encouraging instructions for using the toilet. Recommended for ages 18 months–3.




### We Poop on the Potty
