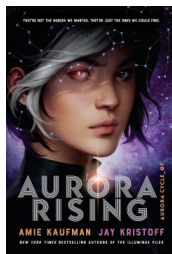

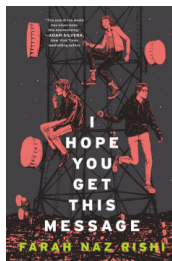

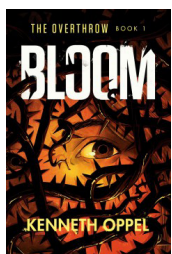
Aurora Rising by Amie Kaufman, Jay Kristoff (Y Kaufman)

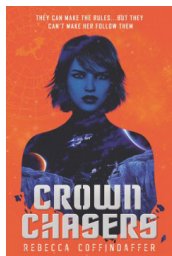
Bloom by Kenneth Oppel (Y Oppel)

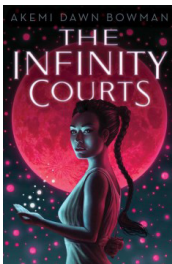
Ignite the Stars by Maura Milan (Y Milan)

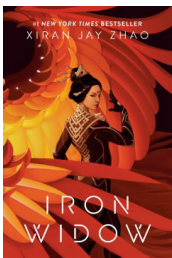
The Infinity Courts by Akemi Dawn Bowman (Y Bowman)

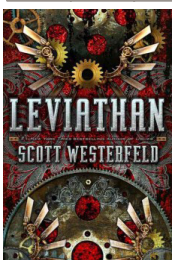
Gearbreakers by Zoe Hana Mikuta (Y Mikuta)

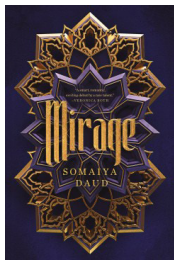
Iron Widow by Xiran Jay Zhao (Y Zhao)

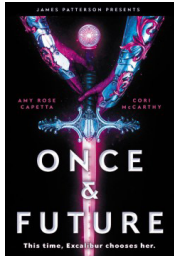
Leviathan by Scott Westerfeld (Y Westerf)

It is the cusp of World War I, and all the European powers are arming up. With the Great War brewing, Alek's and Deryn's paths cross in the most unexpected way.



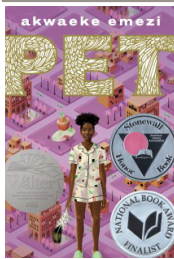
Mirage by Somaiya Daud

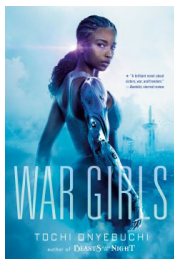
Pet by Akwaeke Emezi

In a near-future society that claims to have gotten rid of all monstrous people, a creature emerges from a painting Jam's mother created.



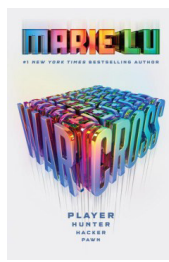
Want by Cindy Pon

(Y Onyebuc)

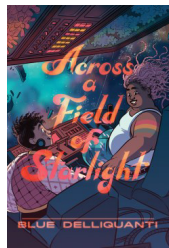

(Y Lu)

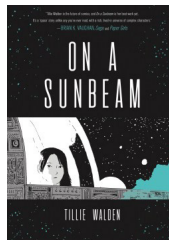

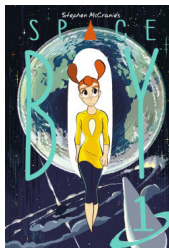
Across a Field of Starlight by Blue Deliquanti
