
YA SCI-FI: DYSTOPIA

Blood Circus by Camila Victoire (YA Fiction–Y Victoir)

When Ava finds herself on the wrong side of a military fence erected to protect the North American Territory, she's captured by Klujns and made to participate in the Blood Race, a macabre tradition where young human hostages compete to the death for Klujn amusement.



Girls with Sharp Sticks by Suzanne Young (YA Fiction-Y Young)

In the near future at a girls-only private high school isolated in the Colorado mountains, Mena and her classmates—under the watchful eyes of their Guardian, professors, and analyst—are trained to be beautiful and obedient for their sponsors and investors.



Dustborn by Erin Bowman (YA Fiction–Y Bowman)

Delta of Dead River has always kept her back hidden: branded on her skin is a map to a rumored paradise called the Verdant. It's a map many in their wasteland would kill for. When her family is abducted by raiders, Delta sets out to rescue them—which means trading the location of Verdant.



Hell Followed with Us by Andrew Joseph White (YA Fiction-Y White)

Benji is on the run from the cult that raised him—the fundamentalist sect that unleashed Armageddon and decimated the world's population. Desperately, he searches for a place where the cult can't get their hands on him, or more importantly, on the bioweapon they infected him with.




Escaping Eleven by Jerri Chrisholm (YA Fiction–Y Chishol)

Four generations ago, the Earth was rendered uninhabitable and those who remained were forced underground. In Compound Eleven, the hierarchy of floors is everything and on Eve Hamilton's floor, they fight. When she meets a boy from the top floor, Eve is no longer content to just survive, she is ready to fight for freedom.



Monsters Born and Made by Tanvi Berwah (YA Fiction-Y Berwah)

Koral and her brother, Emrik, risk their lives to capture the monstrous maristags that live in the black seas around their island. In an oceanic world swarming with vicious beasts, the ruling elite have indentured her family to provide the maristags for the Glory Race, a deadly chariot tournament reserved for the upper class.



The Getaway by Lamar Giles (YA Fiction-Y Giles)

Jay discovers that the mountain resort where he lives and works with his friends and family is also a doomsday oasis for the rich and powerful who expect top-notch customer service even as the world outside the resort's walls disintegrates.



The Ones We're Meant to Find by Joan He (YA Fiction-Y He)

In a near future when life is harsh outside of Earth's last unpolluted place, Cee tries to leave an abandoned island while her sister, STEM prodigy Kasey, seeks escape from the science and home she once trusted.





The Q by Amy Tintera (YA Fiction-Y Tintera)

When the president's son, is kidnapped and pushed out of an airplane over the Q, a vast quarantine zone, Maisie gives him a 72-hour vaccine and together the two teenagers attempt to fight their way through the Q in order to survive.



Sanctuary by Paola Mendoza (YA Fiction–Y Mendoza)

In 2032, when Vali's mother is detained by the Deportation Forces, Vali must flee Vermont with her little brother, Ernie, hoping to reach their Tía Luna in the sanctuary state of California.



Scythe by Neal Shusterman (YA Fiction–Y Shusterman)

In a world where disease has been eliminated, the only way to die is to berandomly killed ('gleaned') by professional reapers ('scythes'). Two teens must compete with each other to become a scythe—a position neither of them wants. The one who becomes a scythe must kill the one who doesn't.



Skyhunter by Marie Lu (YA Fiction-Y Lu)

The Karensa Federation has conquered a dozen countries, leaving Mara as one of the last free nations in the world. Refugees flee to its borders to escape a fate worse than death, transformation into mutant war beasts known as Ghosts. The legendary Strikers, Mara's elite fighting force, are trained to stop these monsters. But, one Striker refuses to give up hope.



Verify by Joelle Charbonneau (YA Fiction–Y Charbon)

Meri Beckley's pride of living in a land of peace, prosperity, and truth crumbles when questions following her mother's death reveal buried facts, especially that words can have great power.



Winter White and Wicked by Shannon Dittemore (YA Fiction-Y Dittemo)

On an island cursed by eternal winter, Sylvi agrees to help a smuggler, but when they reach their destination, Sylvi must decide if she can abandon her cherished solitude and anonymity—and the favor of the icy spirit Winter—to join with the rebels.



Paper Girls, Vol. 1 by Brian K. Vaughan (Graphic Novels–GN Paper Girls v. 1)

In the early hours after Halloween on 1988, four 12-year-old newspaper delivery girls uncover the most important story of all time. Suburban drama and supernatural mysteries collide in this series about nostalgia, first jobs, and the last days of childhood.



Space Trash, Vol. 1 by Jenn Woodall (Graphic Novels–GN Space Trash v. 1)

In 2115, a decrepit high school for underprivileged youth on the moon, Stab, Yuki, and Una are three teenagers who try to keep their boredom and resentment at bay by fighting rival gangs and cliques, and sleeping their way through class, all while trying to avoid punishment from the student council.



Spill Zone, Vol. 1 by Scott Westerfeld (Graphic Novels–GN Spill Zone v. 1)

Three years ago an event destroyed the small city of Poughkeepsie, forever changing reality within its borders. Uncanny manifestations and lethal dangers now await anyone who enters the Spill Zone. The Spill claimed Addison's parents and scarred her little sister who hasn't spoken since. Addison provides for her sister by photographing the Zone's twisted attracctions on illicit midnight rides.



The Woods, Vol. 1: The Arrow by James Tynion IV (Graphic Novels-GN Woods v. 1)

On October 16, 2013, 437 students, 52 teachers, and 24 additional staff from Bay Point Preparatory High School in suburban Milwaukee, WI vanished without a trace. Countless light years away, far outside the bounds of the charted universe, 513 people find themselves in the middle of an ancient, primordial wilderness.
