The 100 revolutionary women featured in this illustrated book were bad in the best sense of the word: they challenged the status quo and changed the rules for those who followed.




Galaxy Girls: 50 Amazing Stories of Women in Space by Libby Jackson (Adult Nonfiction – 920 Jac)


Brazen: Rebel Ladies Who Rocked the World by Pénélope Bagieu (Graphic Novel – GN 920 Bag)


The Good Luck Girls by Charlotte Nicole Davis (Young Adult Fiction – Y Davis)



Tapping into the Rebel Girl and Bad Girl publishing trend, this is the first book to cover the female role within art.




Modern HERstory: Stories of Women and Nonbinary People Rewriting History by Blair Imani (Adult Nonfiction-920 Imal)
