Mango Languages is available through the Library's website and their app, and has courses on over 70 different languages. We also offer access to Rosetta Stone courses for 30 different languages through Inspire, Indiana's Virtual Library. Of course Overdrive (Indiana Digital Media), available through our website or their app, has a collection of foreign language study eBooks and eAudiobooks available, as well as a collection of fiction eBooks in foreign languages.

And for everybody working on their Spanish skills, **don't forget the library hosts Spanish language classes twice each week**. An Intermediate class meets Wednesdays at 1 p.m., and the Advanced class meets Mondays at 10 a.m.
