

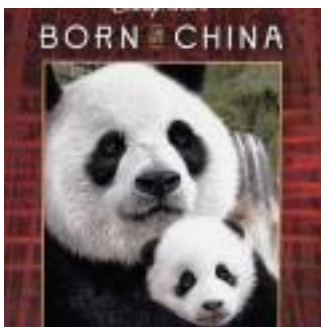
## [For the Animal Lovers](#)

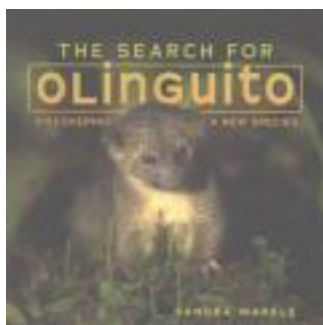
[Imax: Born to be Wild](#)

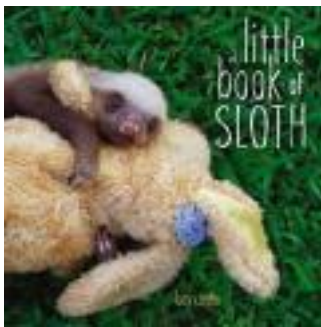
