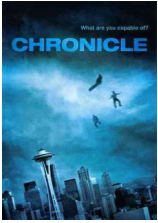


Chronicle

The story is told totally through the lens of cameras. Some are personal cameras, security cameras, dashboard cameras, but without the use of a professional cameraman. When the film started I had fears of the "[Blair Witch Project](#)" and motion sickness. Instead, after a rocky start, I found a film that was very easy to watch and I was entertained. The film flowed easily and believably. I could imagine myself as a teenager facing these same issues. The film was directed by Josh Trank who paces the film smoothly, flowing from one scene to another. The actors, Dane DeHaan, Alex Russel and Michael B. Jordan managed to make themselves believable teenagers. I never once thought of them as anything else. They are the kind of kids I would have hung out with as a teen.
