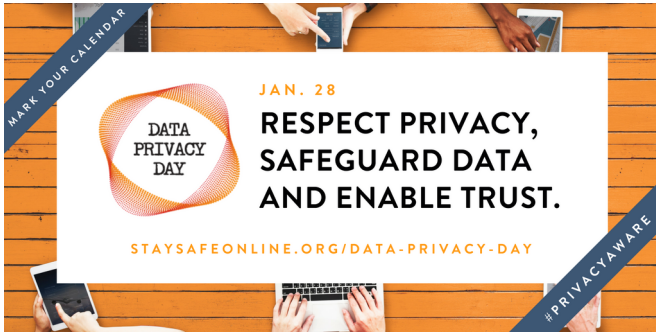


Data Privacy Day

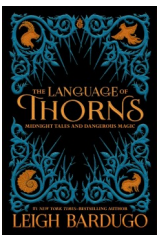
