And why did these ?mercy-killings? happen on the last day even as helicopters were arriving again after a lapse of several days? Toward the end of the book, Fink visits hospitals flooded after Hurricane Sandy. You sense her shock and anger when she realizes that in the intervening seven years little has changed. The hospitals were still unprepared for a major disaster. For a thrilling and sobering look at a hospital and its employees and patients in crises read this book. You won?t forget it.
