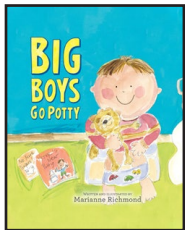


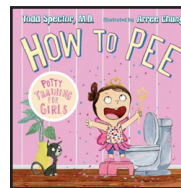
Books About Potty Training

(Juvenile Picture Books – Ej Ric)

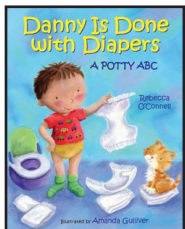

(Juvenile Picture Books Nonfiction – Ej 649.62 Spe)



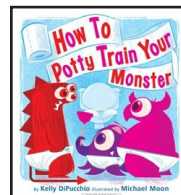

(Juvenile Picture Books – Ej Dip)



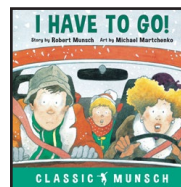

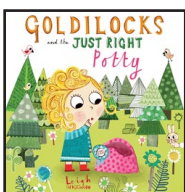
Dinosaur vs. The Potty by Bob Shea

(Juvenile Picture Books – Ej Mun)



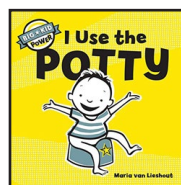

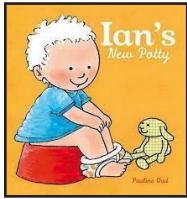
Goldilocks and the Just Right Potty by Leigh Hodgkinson

(Juvenile Picture Books Nonfiction – Ej 649.62 Van)

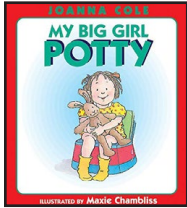


A toddler, tired of diapers, learns to use the big kid toilet. Recommended for ages 3–6.



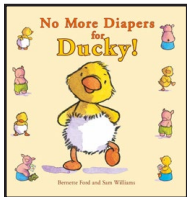
Ian's New Potty

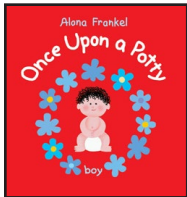
My Big Girl Potty

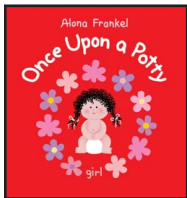
No More Diapers for Ducky!

When Piggy can't come out to play because he is using the potty, Ducky decides it's time for him to learn to use the potty too. Recommended for ages 3–6.



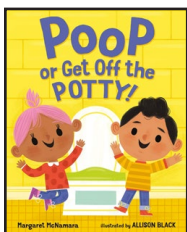
Once Upon a Potty: Boy

Explains in simple text and illustrations why and how a little boy uses a potty. Recommended for ages 3–6.



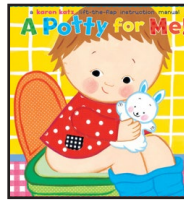
Once Upon a Potty: Girl

Explains in simple text and illustrations why and how a little girl uses a potty. Recommended for ages 3–6.



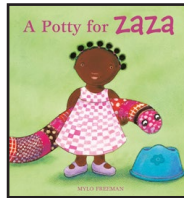
Poop or Get Off the Potty!

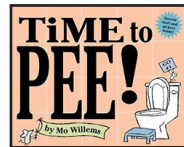
A Potty for Me!

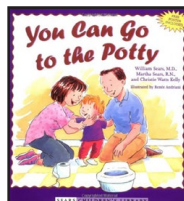
A Potty for Zaza

Mommy shows Zaza a potty. Who could it be for? Is it a potty for Zaza? Recommended for ages 3–6.



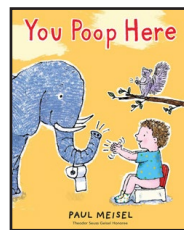
Time to Pee!
